



Total Donations



Last year, the Epiphany School Foundation had an outstanding year. Our Annual Fund raised over \$300,000. In addition, under the stewardship of their respective parent chairpersons, we ran four successful events which generated over \$220,000 in net donations. As a result of these efforts, the Foundation made total grants to the Epiphany School totaling over \$367,000, an all-time high. Through these grants, the School offers programs in math, science, Spanish, music and art and provides development programs for the School's faculty.




Ryder's Lasting Lessons
