



The Science program, where students get the hands-on experience needed to understand and retain complex concepts




Enhancements to the Art and Music programs, which not only provide education in the arts, but also augment learning in other subject areas





What's So Great About...

The Guidance Program?

It's hard to talk to your parents when you're growing up. "That," Denise Dee says, "is why our Guidance Program is so important." Ms. Dee would know. With her Master's degree from St. Bonaventure University and background as both a college admissions counselor and high school guidance counselor, she is well prepared for her role as Epiphany's first full-time guidance counselor.

The program starts with 4th graders, building a safe discussion space in a single-sex setting. The 4th graders discuss friendship and transition, then cover communication skills and responsibility in 5th grade.

As the students mature, the topics become more sophisticated. The 6th graders discuss organization and study skills, which will later lead into discussions of the high school process.

Often, the students drive the discussion, as one 7th grade class did. Concerned that they were growing too cliquish, the students discussed how they could be more inclusive. "It showed a lot of maturity for these girls to recognize the problem and solve it responsibly," said Ms. Dee. They also discuss puberty, substance abuse, and changes in their lives.

Ms. Dee also guides 7th and 8th graders through high school admissions. She streamlines the process, providing a calendar of upcoming open houses, tests, and deadlines. Her students appreciate the help. As one student put it, "I'm applying to 18 schools. It's a lot of pressure, but the calendar helps me keep on top of it."

In addition to working with students, Ms. Dee offers information and advice to parents. As a former college admissions counselor, she can help parents understand the application process and give insight into which schools are the best fit for their children.

This help, along with the Catholic values taught alongside it, sets up students and parents for the best possible high school experience. "That's what we're here for," says Ms. Dee.





What's So Great About...

The Reading Specialist?

"Reading is fundamental to everything we do here." explains Kerry Jones. "That's why it's so important to help struggling students before they fall behind."

Mrs. Jones taught for a year at Epiphany, then for the city school system, where she worked with many struggling new readers. To better serve these students, she returned to Bank Street College of Education, where she had earned her Master's degree, for a post-masters degree in Reading and Literacy. At the same time, she interned with the Bank Street School for Children, teaching young students with reading difficulties.

Mrs. Jones' experience benefits each child at Epiphany. She works with the kindergarteners for 45 minutes every week. In addition to seeing the words on the page, the children spell them out loud and trace them in the air. These varied ways of learning help all the children reach their potential.

The kindergarteners also benefit from Mrs. Jones' experience at the Reading and Writing Project at Columbia Teacher's College, where she studied the last two summers. "These courses help," she says, "because they give me new tools to teach the same material, so I can teach the students however they learn best."

First and second graders who need additional reinforcement participate in small group practice. Mrs. Jones teaches these groups with the Orton-Gillingham program, which emphasizes teaching the same concept with many different methods.

This early focus serves Epiphany students well as the curriculum becomes more difficult in later grades. With a sound foundation in reading skills, the students are well equipped to master complicated topics in science and clearly express their thoughts in history. As Mrs. Jones says, "It lets us make sure they're all ready."





What's So Great About...

The Art and Music Programs?

Together with traditional, core subjects, art and music teach students to communicate and reason logically. In fact, early and sustained exposure to art and music promote creative problem-solving skills that help children understand other subjects—from math and science to language arts and social studies.

That's why these subjects are a focus for providing new technologies, techniques, and materials, all of which are made possible thanks to support from the Foundation.

The process of creating art is one that nurtures the inventive nature of children. Opportunities provided by the Foundation to the art program allow students to learn experientially by creating individual projects in different media, such as clay sculpture, which is fired in the school's kiln, and photography, for which specific Mac computers are set aside. The enhanced art program celebrates the individual and teaches students to respect and value one another's different ways of thinking.

Music, too, allows students to use their imaginations and creativity. The 25 keyboards in the upper school music room and the lower school's glockenspiels, hand bells, maracas, and rhythm sticks—all provided by the Foundation—give students the chance to experiment with many different sounds. Reading music, studying composition, and learning music theory in a "hands-on" approach with these instruments invokes the higher-order thinking skills that underline learning across the curriculum. And performing together reinforces awareness of others and cooperation.

By starting early and having such a broad range of opportunities, the Art and Music programs at Epiphany help prepare students to appreciate a future of invaluable experiences—art and music related or otherwise—as confident, self-directed, inquiring individuals.



Principal for a Day

The Epiphany School is blessed to have at its helm a true leader and superb educator — Principal James L. Hayes. Jim Hayes joined the Epiphany staff during the school year of 1977-78 as a Science teacher and was named Principal in 1978-79. During his 30 years of service, the school has gone through many transformations. The enrollment has more than doubled to today's current number of about 513 students, representing 380 families who reside in over 50 zip codes in and around New York City.

As enrollment increased, more space was needed. In 1991 Epiphany acquired Saint Stephen's School on 28th Street. That building now houses the Nursery program, one Pre-K class and the upper grades — 4th through 8th.

Periodically a guest Principal steps in and becomes "Principal for a Day". On a few occasions, Mr. Jack Rudin, our largest individual benefactor, has graced us with his presence. He has visited classrooms, bought ice cream treats for the children and observed the latest strides in all the classrooms in technology, smart boards, etc., many of which have been funded by his generosity.


In May of 2008, Mr. Ed McLaughlin visited both the upper and lower school in the role of Principal for a Day. He is the uncle of David McLaughlin Bery, now a 7th grader. Mr. McLaughlin is a huge proponent and supporter of Catholic education at every level.

In a follow-up letter to Principal Jim Hayes, Mr. McLaughlin stated: "I was impressed with the students, the faculty, the parents and the overall commitment to Catholic education and values. Everyone I met was energized and interested in learning, achieving and growing. You and your staff should be very proud! I know that my nephew is getting a great education while building lifelong relationships."

He also stated that the Epiphany education is equivalent to the educational experience offered at far more costly schools.
