The Foundation was established in 1999 to enrich the spiritual and educational experience of each and every child enrolled at the School. The supplemental funding we provide helps keep tuition at an affordable level, attracting and maintaining a diverse student population. Our strong academic curriculum, combined with our Catholic faith and values, contribute to our success in raising tomorrow's leaders today.

# Why is the Foundation so vital to The Epiphany School?

Support for the Foundation fuels the mission of the School: to provide an educational environment that inspires academic achievement, fosters spiritual growth, and celebrates the individual.



#### **Technology**

With the advanced technology used in Epiphany classrooms, teachers are able to incorporate media into their lessons and activities, and save their notes for future lessons. Each RealTouch Board is connected to an AppleTV, allowing students, teachers, and guests to display their work from any digital device to the full size screen. The success of the iPad Program launch in 2012 has led to a full 1:1 iPad program for all students in grades 2–8, a 1:2 iPad program in 1st and 2nd grades, and iPad Centers in Nursery and Pre-Kindergarten. The iPads also allow teachers to differentiate instruction and personalize learning.

#### **Environmental Center**

The Environmental Center adds a key component to Epiphany's science curriculum by giving students the opportunity to take control of their own learning. Through our hydroponic system, students view the cycles of nature first-hand and discover how plants and animals rely on each other within their environment. With this knowledge, our students learn how to make the right decisions to best preserve the earth, including recycling materials, composting leftover cafeteria food to create nutritious soil, and exploring how environmental science applies to daily life.

#### WITS (Wellness In The Schools)

Through the implementation of the WITS program, Epiphany students benefit from healthier lunch options in the cafeteria. Partnering with the Department of Education, Chef Gisselle and Chef Evie prepare daily school lunches cooked from scratch. WITS Labs, our in-classroom cooking classes, teach students how to prepare delicious, affordable, healthy recipes using real food. The WITS program is now celebrated at Epiphany, promoting healthy eating both at school and at home.



#### **Tuition Assistance**

hrough the generosity of our donors, Epiphany offers tuition assistance to families in need. The School offers tuition assistance to newly enrolled students every year as well as to current families who request financial aid. Many Epiphany families benefit from full or partial tuition assistance.

#### **Assistant Teaching Program**

S tudents in grades K-3 have one Head
Teacher and one Assistant Teacher in each
classroom. The Assistant Teaching Program
allows for a 1:12 student/faculty ratio at our
Lower School Campus on East 22nd Street.
Many of our Assistant Teachers are pursuing
advanced degrees and benefit from working
with our students and leaders in the classroom.



#### **Faculty Development**

piphany teachers further their knowledge of instructional methods and resources through ongoing professional development. The Foundation provide funds for this program, which keeps teachers up-to-date with emerging technology and curriculum tools in the classroom. Through unique learning platforms such as IXL and Reading A-Z, teachers are able to monitor each student's individual needs. Our faculty recently received training from Google Education for Teachers, educating them on how to use Google Technology in the classrooms. Teachers in grades 1-8 attended a workshop with Go Math!, an engaging and hands-on approach to covering new state standards in mathematics. Faculty members pursuing an advanced degree also receive tuition assistance through the Professional Development Program.





Walkers made their way down to the Williamsburg Bridge before returning to the lively festivities in front of our Lower School Campus. The event raised over \$75,000 and our Feeding Our Neighbors Food Drive collected enough canned goods to provide over 6,000 meals.

# The Hall of Fame Induction and Reception

The Third Annual Hall of Fame Induction and Cocktail Reception honored founding Epiphany School Foundation board members, Michael J. Tierney '65 and Philip J. McManus, Esq., as well as Mary Jane Maher Higgins '80, Epiphany School Vice-Principal and alumna. Over 250 guests attended the reception at The Yale Club on November 7, 2015. Alumnus speaker, Jake Brassil '08, shared heartfelt words with the crowd as guests learned about the importance of sponsoring Epiphany students. The event, chaired by **Kristin Shea '78**, raised over \$33,000, making it the most successful Hall of Fame in Epiphany's history.

#### The Christmas Car Raffle


## **The Epiphany School**


# **The Epiphany School Foundation**
