Ray Curley was born and raised in the Parkchester section of the Bronx, or as “Bronxites” would say, he is from St. Helena’s parish. The youngest of three children, Ray followed in the footsteps of his siblings, Jane and Bob, attending St. Helena’s School and St. Helena’s High School. While in high school, the name of the school was changed to Msgr. Scanlan High School to honor the long time pastor, Msgr. Arthur Scanlan. Ray continued his Bronx education attending Manhattan College where he received a Bachelors of Science degree in Business Administration.

After graduation, he pursued a career in the hospitality industry in Hampton Bays, Westhampton Beach and Hunter Mountain. In 1980, Ray became a partner in Wilson’s Garage, a legendary Westhampton Beach nightclub, which later became known as Casey’s Dancehall and Saloon.

Since 2007, Ray has been employed by Anheuser-Busch InBev in a variety of positions. He is currently the Senior District Sales Manager for New York City.

Ray was instrumental in developing the Epiphany intramural basketball program and served as director of the CYO basketball program. He served on the committee for the inaugural Epiphany Golf Outing and is currently serving on the planning committee for the 150th Anniversary of The Church of the Epiphany.
